#### The HPS Experience— Science

The design brief was this: using only the materials provided (two pieces of foil 30x30cm and 15x15cm) can you design something that: floats without support and hold cargo? Students in 4-6 were taught about the Design Process, used by many professions including engineers, scientists and inventors. They were initially given time to brainstorm, collaborate and discuss their plans, before attempting their first design using paper. They then explored the properties of foil to fold, tear, scrunch and crimp to hold the structure together. They then put their innovator hats on, to build their prototype. A short testing phase followed, ensuring that all designs met the brief. It was back to the brainstorming and planning phase, to problem solve and enhance their designs.

Up next: the final build and testing phase. We will report back with our final results.
